What are nouns?

Nouns are words we use to name things and objects. Nouns do not describe how things are, they only name things. For example: time, buildings, pencil sharpener, glass, unicorn, wolf, creativity, fun, health, forty, height, velocity, etc.

→ Singular nouns: there is only one. We use a or an or one before.

→ Plural: There are two or more. They end with letter -S, -ES or -IES.

Spelling rules for plural Nouns:

1) -S: We add S at the end to the singular noun, e.g.:

Bed ---> BedS

Cloud ---> CloudS

Exam ---> ExamS

2) -ES: If the noun ends in: -sh, -x, -s, -ch we write ES at the end, and we pronounce / IZ / e.g.:

Research ---> ResearchES

Church ---> ChurchES

Tax---> TaxES

Watch ---> WatchES

Box ---> BoxES

Wish ---> WishES

Six ---> SixES

Mass ---> MassES

Class ---> ClassES

Fish ---> fishES (remember this one)

3) -IES: The last two letters of the singular noun are a consonant and an Y, you take out the Y and write IES, we pronounce / is / e.g.:

Activity ---> ActivitIES

Party ---> PartIES

Country ---> CountrIES

Photocopy ---> PhotocopIES

Family ---> FamilIES

Baby ---> BabIES

4- Always plurals:



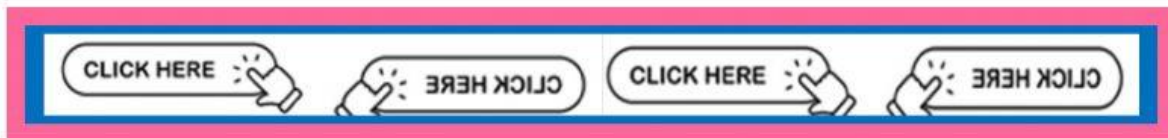
Plural nouns

Some words for things are always plural, e.g. *glasses, headphones, scissors*. Don't use *a / an* with plural nouns. **NOT** *a-glasses, a-headphones*.

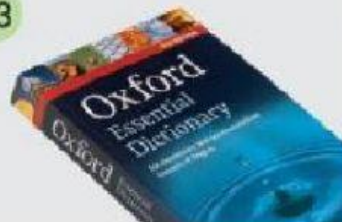

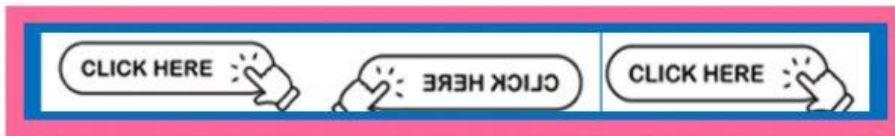
