

USED TO, WOULD, BE USED TO

USED TO: indicates something that happened in the past, but doesn't happen now. And
DIDN'T USE TO: indicates something that didn't happen in the past

used to + infinitive Ex. When I was a child, I used to go to school by bus.

WOULD: We use would for repeated actions or routines in the past. We do not use would with stative verbs, because they describe states and not actions

would + infinitive Ex. My dad would always read to me before bed.

BE USED TO: it's used when something is not new, unusual or strange for us. It is used in all tenses.

be used to + noun OR gerund Ex. I am used to getting up early.
