

Subject and Verb Agreement

The subject of a sentence must agree with the verb.

If the subject is singular (just 1) then the verb ends with an s.

Subject - singular	Verb -s
She, he, it, the boy, the car, the dog	Walks, read, goes, cooks, lives, runs, barks

If the subject is plural (more than 1) then the verb does not end with an s

Subject - plural	Verb
The girls, the dogs, the buses, the men, the children, the ladies	Walk, bark, run, go, read, talk, play, read

BUT – exception. If the subject is I or you – the verb has NO s, even though it is singular.

Subject	Verb
I, you	Walk, run, go, read, talk, play, read, live
