

HAS GOT/HASN'T GOT

The verb have got means “tener”

We are going to use “has got” to say the personal attributes of animals. And hasn’t got to deny.

El verbo “have got” significa “tener”.

Vamos a utilizar “has got” para decir los atributos personales de los animales y “hasn’t got” para negar. Es decir, vamos a usarlo para describir las partes que tienen o no tienen los animales.

It has got a tail = It’s got a tail
It hasn’t got a beak
