They	Their	suyo/a	Them	a / para ellos / ellas

Substitute or take the place of the NOUN (name)

- Emilia = She
- Emilia y Camila = they
- Teacher = he / she
- Museum = it
- Dogs - they

Indicates the possession or ownership.

This is my pen. His pen is red.

I - my. He - his

Our teacher is from México.

We nosotros / Our- nuestra

These are their uniforms

They -ellos / their de ellos

Object Pronoun identify the "D.O. -Direct Object- that is the "direction" to whom the action moves.

- Give this pen to him.
- The letter was address to me.
- This gift is for her.
- The diplomas will be given to us.

➤ \* Note: the collocation is always at the end.


