

**PRESENT PERFECT WITH TIME EXPRESSIONS**

1. Ever/never. Used to talk about general life experiences.

**Examples:**

Have you.....been to Berga?

He has .....worked abroad.

2. Already. Used to emphasize that an action has happened.

**Example:**

We are too late the train .....left.

3. We use just in affirmative sentences to show that an action happened very recently.

**Examples:**

They have.....lunch. They can't be hungry.

We have .....him. He looks very friendly.

4. We use yet to ask if something has happened or to say that something hasn't happened.

**Examples:**

Have you finished the.....?

Susan hasn't.....

**Notes:**

5. We use still in negative sentences to emphasize that something hasn't changed.

**Example:**

We .....found the book that Sarah lost last June.

### PAST SIMPLE

<b>1. Used when the action is finished</b> <b>Example:</b> I ..... in London for three years
<b>2. Time is usually specified</b> <b>Example:</b> I ..... Berlin last year
<b>3. The period of time is finished</b> <b>Example:</b> She ..... last week

### PAST CONTINUOUS

<b>1. Used to talk about actions in progress at a specific point in the past.</b> <b>Example:</b> When the teacher arrived, we ..... on the tables.
<b>2. Used to describe a context or set the scene.</b> <b>Example:</b> The girls ..... when John opened the door.

### PRESENT PERFECT SIMPLE

<b>1. Used to talk about past experiences.</b> <b>Unspecified time.</b> <b>Example:</b> I ..... this film before.
<b>2. Used to show the present result of an action started in the past.</b> <b>Example:</b> I ..... my bedroom
<b>3. Used to say that something started in the past and continues up to now.</b> <b>Stative verbs or permanent actions.</b> <b>Example:</b> I ..... him since he was a child.

### PRESENT PERFECT CONTINUOUS

<b>1. Used to show the present result of an action that started in the past. The action isn't finished.</b> <b>Example:</b> I ..... my bedroom. I haven't finished yet.
<b>2. Used to say that something started in the past and continues up to now. Temporary actions or to emphasize that an action is ongoing.</b> <b>Example:</b> He ..... with his parents since he arrived from London.
