## Reading section

*Business experts disagree about the benefits of working as a family. Some say that family businesses are more likely to succeed. Others say that family businesses do not create new ideas, and are likely to fall over time. Here, one family explains how it works for them.*

### **Elena – mother**

I was really pleased when my father asked for some help in his restaurant. The business needs a reliable manager and I'm good with money. Unlike the rest of the family I'm quite shy, so working in the office suits me very well. In fact, working here really suits us all. Agustin welcomes the customers and organizes the tables. ### **Vincente – grandfather**

I go to the market early in the morning and see what is good. Then I go back to the kitchen and decide the menu for the day. ### **Mariana – Elena's oldest child**
