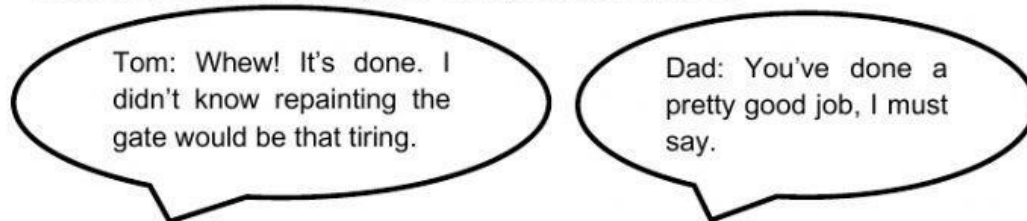

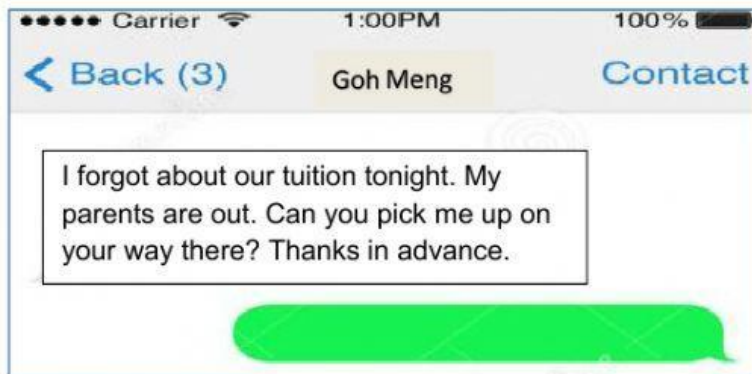

Walnuts

Walnuts are the oldest tree food known to man. History records show that walnuts originated in ancient Persia. These walnuts were solely reserved for Persian royalty and thus they were called the Persian walnuts. Although England did not grow walnuts commercially, English merchants have been recorded trading walnuts since 1567. It was through this trade that walnuts became known as English walnuts.

Walnuts have a rich cultural heritage in many countries. In ancient times, the Greeks ate walnuts to increase fertility, whilst a Roman wedding custom was to throw walnuts at the bride and groom to encourage fertility. As for Bulgarian folks, they believed that planting a walnut tree prior to carrying out a certain task will prevent premature death. However, generally in folklore, walnuts were related to the healing and strengthening of the heart and warding off rheumatism.

Today, walnuts are grown in over 60 countries around the globe. They are harvested from both cultivated orchards and wild populations. Walnuts are probably best known for their hard-to-open shells and brain-like shape. No wonder they are good brain food — they look like little brains! From medieval times, Europeans have blanched, crushed and soaked walnuts to create nutritious 'milk'. In modern times, walnuts are usually roasted or eaten raw.

Mangosteen

This globular fruit has a purplish-brown skin. The mangosteen has a sweet pleasant taste and is rich in vitamin C and other essential minerals. The taste of the Malaysian mangosteen is so delicious that this fruit is much sought after by tourist from Europe, the United States, China and Japan. The mangosteen season peaks in early June and late December each year.

Rambutan

Very similar to lychee, rambutan is an egg-shaped fruit covered with dark, thin hair and grows in bunches. The yellow or red rambutan is rich in vitamin C and other essential minerals. The translucent flesh inside the rambutan is soft and sweet. The rambutan peak season is April until July or December until January. The best time harvest rambutans is in August.

Watermelon

This fruit is available throughout the year. The flesh is deep red bright yellow. This is occasionally served as a dessert in restaurants. Some watermelons have seeds while some are seedless. Chilled watermelon juice is readily available at most food stalls and restaurants. It is a popular fruit drink in Malaysia.

Jackfruit

This fruit is also available throughout the year. The golden flesh around the seed is succulent and has a very special taste. The jackfruit can be very sweet too and its taste is likened to honey. The seeds must be boiled or roasted before they can be eaten. The jackfruit can be eaten fresh and sometimes, it is found in salads.
