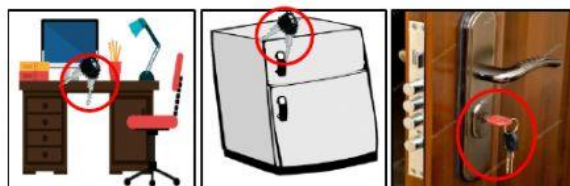

Natasha


