ASKING THE AGE

Look at the grammar points.

ENGLISH GRAMMAR

To Be + Age



To Be + number + years old

- I **am** 23 years old.
- You **are** 16 years old.
- He **is** 32 years old.
- Mary **is** 45 years old.

Years old is optional.
You can say:

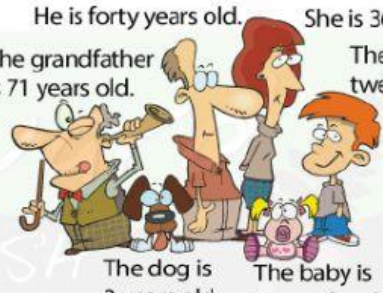
- I am 18 **years old**. **OR**
- I am 18.

BUT... years + old
are always together

- I am 21. ✓
- I am 21 years. ✗
- I am 21 years old. ✓

You can write the age as numbers or as words.

- I am **12** years old.
- I am **twelve** years old.



He is forty years old. She is 36.
The grandfather is 71 years old. The boy is twelve.

The dog is 3 years old. The baby is 5 months old.

With babies, you can use months instead of years.

- The baby is 4 **months** old.
- She is nine **months** old.

Be Careful - In English we use the verb TO BE and not another verb.

- I have 18. ✗
- I have 18 years. ✗
- I have 18 years old. ✗
- I **am** 18. ✓
- I **am** 18 years old. ✓
