



Review Tenses

Use of Present Continuous (Present Progressive)

Subject + Verb to be (is, am, are) + Verb -ing

- used for actions going on in the moment of speaking and for actions taking place only for a short period of time
- used to express development and actions that are arranged for the near future.

Signal Words of Present Continuous

- **at the moment, at this moment, today, now, right now, Listen! Look!**

Use of Present Perfect

Subject + Verb to have (has, have) + Past Participle (V.3)

- puts emphasis on the result
Example: *She has written five letters.*
- action that is still going on
Example: *School has not started yet.*
- action that stopped recently
Example: *She has cooked dinner.*
- finished action that has an influence on the present
Example: *I have lost my key.*
- action that has taken place once, never or several times before the moment of speaking
Example: *I have never been to Australia.*

Signal Words of Present Perfect

- **already, ever, just, never, not yet, so far, till now, up to now**



Use of Past Simple

Subject + V.2 (Past Simple)

- action in the past taking place once, never or several times
Example: He *visited* his parents every weekend.
- actions in the past taking place one after the other
Example: He *came in*, *took off* his coat and *sat down*.
- action in the past taking place in the middle of another action
Example: When I *was having* breakfast, the phone suddenly *rang*.
- if sentences type II (If I talked, ...)
Example: If I *had* a lot of money, I would share it with you.

Signal Words of Past Simple

- yesterday, 2 minutes ago, in 1990, the other day, last Friday
- If-clause Type II (If I talked, ...)

Use of Past Perfect

Subject + had + Past Participle (V.3)

- action taking place before a certain time in the past (putting emphasis only on the fact, not the duration)
Example: Before I *came here*, I *had spoken* to Jack.
- Conditional Sentences Type III (condition that was not given in the past)
Example: If I *had seen* him, I would have talked to him.

Signal Words of Past Perfect

- already, just, never, not yet, once, until that day (with reference to the past, not the present)
- If-clause Type III (If I had talked, ...)
