Glossary:

1. Crisps. Countable noun, plural British. A thin flat round piece of potato that has been cooked in fat and is eaten cold. The *American word is chip or potato chip.*
2. Battery. Countable noun. an object that fits into something such as a radio, clock, or car and supplies it with electricity. E.g. I need some new *batteries* for my Walkman.
3. Muffin. Countable noun. A small sweet cake that often contains fruit.
4. Egg. Countable noun. the round object with a shell that a female bird produces and a baby bird develops in. The mother bird lays an egg, and later the egg hatches and the baby bird comes out.
5. Ramen. Uncountable noun. a Japanese dish consisting of thin noodles in broth with meat and vegetables
6. Yoghurt. Uncountable noun. Yogurt also spelled *yoghurt, yogourt or yoghourt*, is a food produced by bacterial fermentation of milk often sweetened and flavored.
