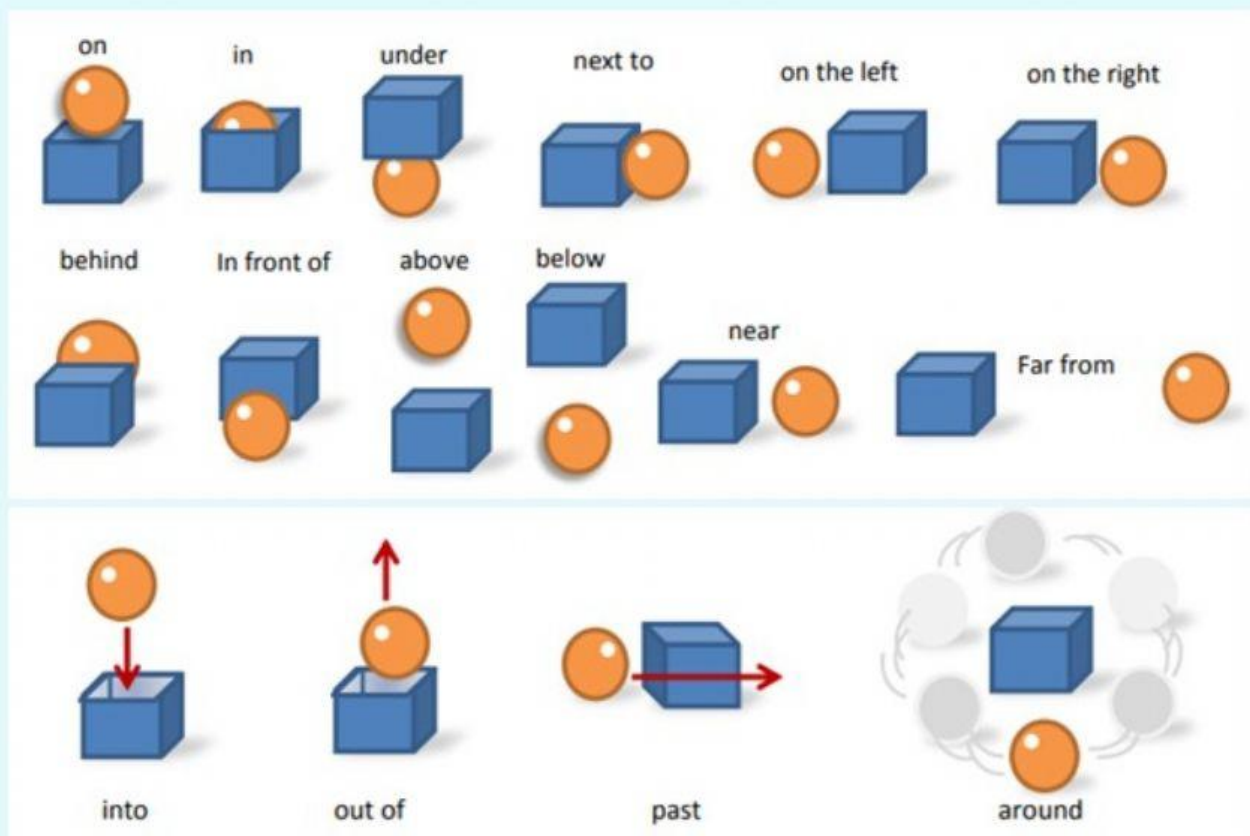


Prepositions of Place
