We need to take care of the animals around us.

Human life cycle

We grow and change throughout our life. The human life cycle consists of five stages:



Infancy (0 to 2 years old)

- The infant depends on his or her parents for everything.



Childhood (3 to 11 years old)

- The child grows and explores the world around him or her.



Adolescence (12 to 18 years old)

- The adolescent is developing into an adult. His or her body changes and his or her reproductive organs become mature.



Adulthood (19 to 65 years old)

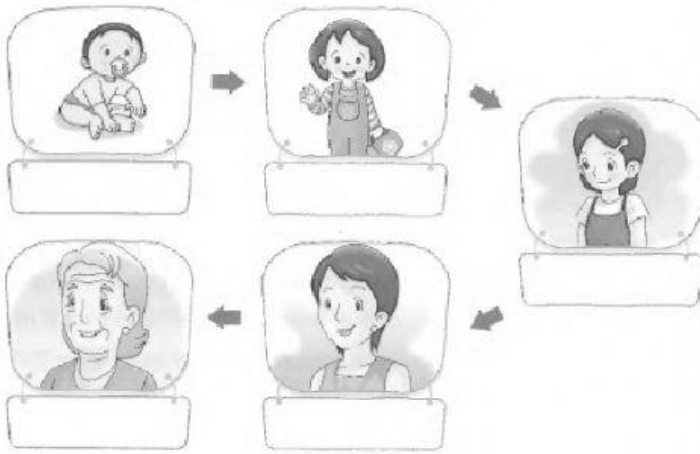
- The human body is fully developed. The adults start to set up their own family and have their own children.



Old age (above 66 years old)

- When humans get older, the body gets weaker. Old people cannot see or listen clearly.
