How to form superlative adjectives?

We usually add -est to	one-syllable	words:
------------------------	--------------	--------

old

If an adjective ends in -e, we only add -st

nice

nicest

oldest

If an adjective ends in a vowel and a consonant, we double the consonant:

big

biggest

If an adjective ends in a consonant and -y, we change -y to -i and add -st:

happy

happiest

We use **more** to make comparatives for most two syllable adjectives and for all adjectives with three or more syllables:

Interesting

most interesting
