## Reading:

A wedding is a ceremony where two people are united in marriage. Wedding traditions and customs are different in every culture. In most weddings, people dance and offer gifts to each other. Usually, the groom and the bride wear clothes special for the occasion. Music, poetry, prayers or readings from religious texts are also common in such a celebration.

Some people have adopted the traditional Western custom of wearing a white dress. The bride wears a white wedding dress and veil. This custom was introduced by Queen Victoria. The white dress is symbolic for purity.

In many cultures, hospitality is also important in wedding celebrations. Guests are usually offered food and drinks. The guests gather around tables to talk and share the food.

Wedding rings also are common in many countries. The groom and the bride offer rings to each other during the celebration. The origin of this custom is unknown. Some believe that it was introduced by the ancient Romans.

Wedding ceremonies change. But some customs remain unchanged for a long period of time. Some of them are wearing white dresses, wearing rings and, of course, slicing a huge cake.
