Mosquito Facts

(35) Their itchy, irritating bites and nearly constant presence can ruin a backyard event or a hiking trip. They have an ability to sense our murderous intentions, taking flight and disappearing milliseconds before a fatal swat. (36) They are number one public enemy in the fight against global infectious disease. Mosquito-borne disease cause millions of deaths worldwide every year. (37)

There are more than 3,000 species of mosquitoes, but the members of the *Anopheles*, *Culex* and *Aedes* mosquitoes bear primary responsibility for the spread of human diseases, such as malaria, encephalitis and dengue. Mosquitoes use exhaled carbon dioxide, body odours and temperature, and movement to home in on their victims. Only female mosquitoes have the mouth parts necessary for sucking blood. (38) For food, both males and females eat nectar and other plant sugars.

The only silver lining to that cloud of mosquitoes in your garden is that they are a reliable source of food for thousands of animals, including birds, bats, dragonflies and frogs. (39) They usually prefer horses, cattle and birds. All mosquitoes need water to breed. (40) Insecticide spraying to kill adult mosquitoes is also widespread.
