**ALREADY** Means that something happened earlier than we expect. With Present Perfect tense **already** usually goes after **have** or **has** and before **the main verb**.

Example: I've **already seen** that film. I don't **want** to **see** it again.

**YET** Means that something that we expected has happened or hasn't happened. We usually put it at the end of a sentences.

Example: Mishel **has bought** a new dress but she **hasn't worn** it yet.
