

SECOND CONDITIONAL

REMEMBER!!

- We use Second Conditional to talk about imaginary impossible or hypothetical situations.
- Second conditional is made of two parts: **IF CLAUSE + MAIN CLAUSE**.
- If clause = **verb in past**
- Main clause = **would/could+ infinitive verb**
- **Example:** If you were a good friend, we wouldn't have problems
