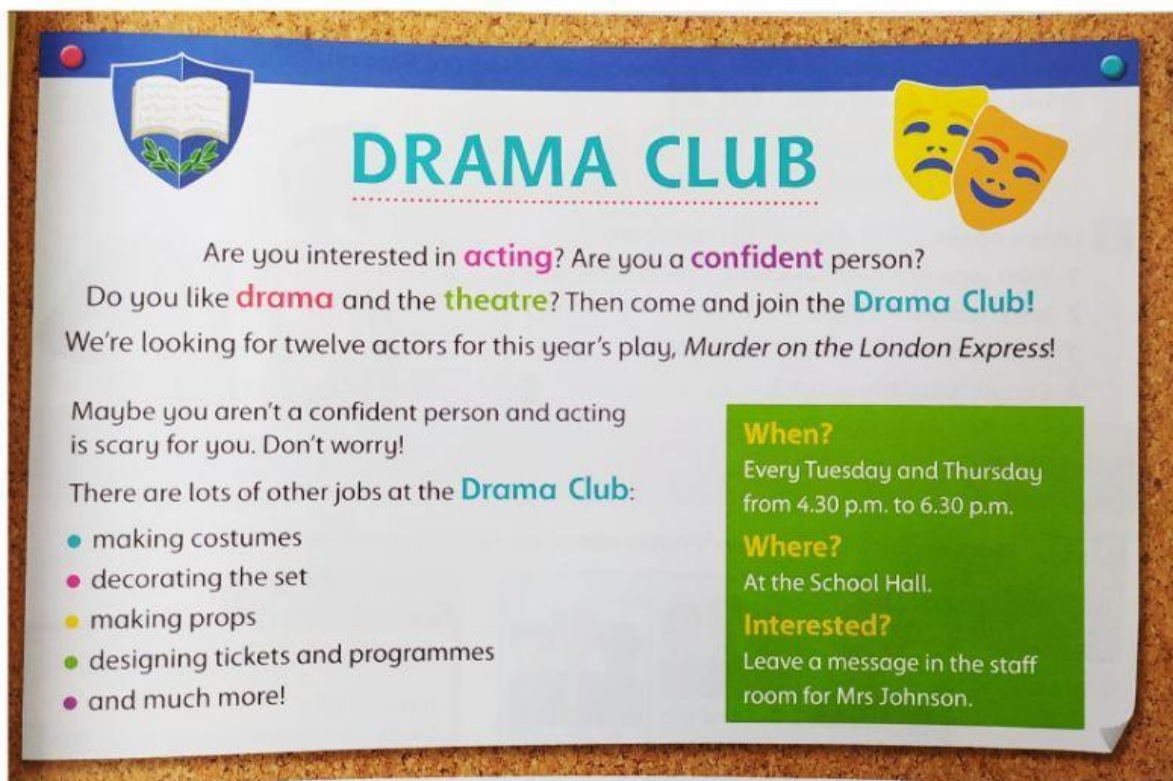


LESSON 7 "LITERACY: NON-FICTION" READING COMPREHENSION
