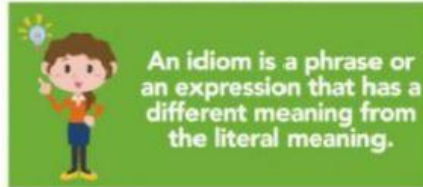


# Idioms - Face & body parts
