### Adverbs of frequency

With the verb be, we use this word order: subject + verb + adverb of frequency.

With other verbs, we use this word order: subject + adverb of frequency + verb.

- ✓ He **is always** friendly.
- ✗ He **always is** friendly.
- ✓ I **often watch** football on TV.
- ✗ I **watch often** football on TV.
