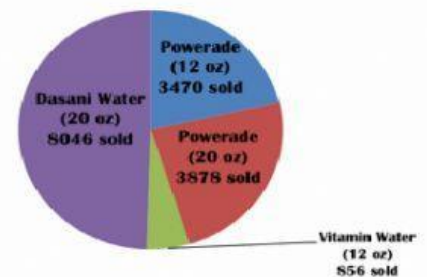

PART 3

Question 19 to 26 are based on the following passage. Choose the correct answer.

Sometimes seeking thrills and adventures can just land people into deep trouble. Four men learned it the hard way when they took part in their first rowing race across the Pacific. Their boat was sinking and they were in the middle of the ocean!

Colin Parker and Fraser Hunt had been friends since teenagers. They both enjoyed extreme sports and the feel of adrenalin rush. One day, Fraser threw the idea of participating in a boat race to Colin. Neither of them had any experience so Colin was sceptical at first but Fraser successfully coaxed him into agreeing. They still had ample time to practise.

The two, with another 11 teams registered for the 2014 Great Pacific Race. The organisers helped them to have a complete team by introducing Sam Collins, an experienced sailor and James Wight, a mountain climber. Fraser was chosen as the skipper for the team.

Everyone was serious in the preparation for the race. They practised on rowing machines in gymnasiums as well as taking courses on navigation and survival at sea. They also found sponsors to cover all the cost. The men were able to rent a 7.3m boat for the race and named it Britannia 4.

The men arrived one week earlier to prepare for the race because there was still a lot of things to be done. Then, the organisers insisted on inspecting the boats used by each team. It was sad news when the boat experts revealed that Britannia 4 was not fit for the ocean-going race. Fraser and his team members were devastated. They were already in the last stage but if the cost of repairing the boat was so high, they could not afford it. Fortunately for them, a local boat builder agreed to repair the boat at a reasonable cost. The boat went through a second check and the inspection team was satisfied with its condition.

The team was set off a day later because they had missed the official start of the race. When the men were in the small boat being surrounded by water, reality began to sink in. It would be no easy feat for them to keep on surviving. It seemed to be going fine at first but things started to change.

Sam discovered one of the boat compartments was filled with sea water. He emptied it out but it got flooded again. Despite the repairs made, the inspection, the boat still failed to get through the rough waves. The seals had loosened and water rushed into the different sections of the compartment.

The men had no option but to call for help although they would be disqualified from the race. Sam contacted the race organiser. However, the support vessel, Galen Diana would only be able to reach their location in another ten hours. They could only wait but when Galen Diana arrived, strong waves prevented the rescue mission. The vessel was in a turbulence state and the skipper tried his best to approach the small boat. He desperately wanted to ask the men to leave their boat and swim to the rescue vessel but it was quite impossible. They risked being swept by strong currents or being hit by the vessel. Then, the situation got worse when the electricity in the small boat blew out. It was so cold and everyone was worried that hypothermia might set in.

Meanwhile, the organiser contacted the coastguard. The officer on duty, Chris Leon, set off with his helicopter crew. It was a challenge to work with waves as high as 4.5 metres. Sam was first lifted up into the helicopter, followed by James and Colin. The helicopter needed refueling and would have to come back later for Chris and Fraser, their skipper. Both waited in agony before finally being rescued.

Chris Leon became a hero and was congratulated for a great job done. He said, "It was a big risk but it's worth the reward. My motivation is to help people." In spite of the grueling experience, the men are not discouraged to try again. The experience made them stronger in facing more challenges.

How do we keep this disease at bay? First, we need to wash our hands very often with soap and water or sanitiser. Wearing a mask is essential as well so that we will not inhale the virus floating in the air when people infected by Covid-19 sneeze or cough. Lastly, we should avoid crowded places. [32]_____.
