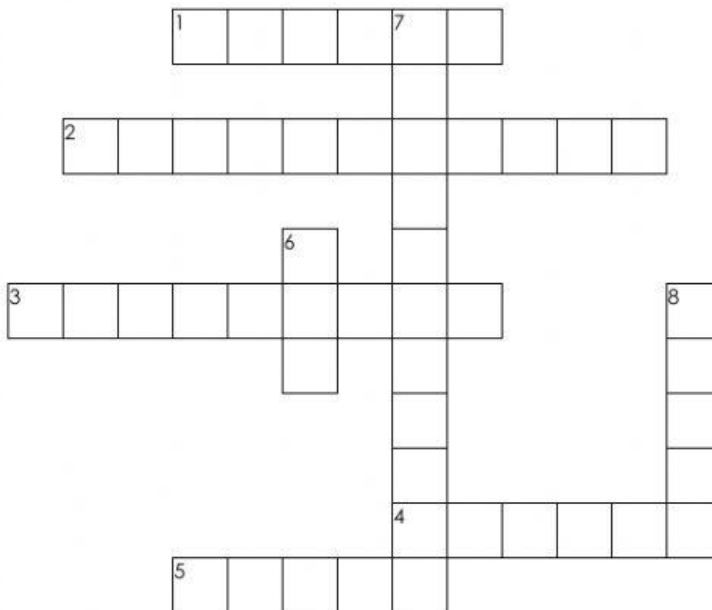


Let's read.

Putri	: You already have a mobile phone. Why do you want a new one?
Vincent	: It's the latest model.
Putri	: My father says that we should buy things that we need, not what we want.
Vincent	: I really like it. I wish I had plastic money to pay for it.
Ben	: Plastic money? What's that?
Vincent	: A credit card. It's a special plastic card that you can use to pay things. My uncle calls it his 'plastic money'.
Putri	: Do you know that when you use a credit card, you are using money that is not yours? It's like borrowing money from a bank. When you borrow money, you have to pay it back. The more times you use the card, the more money you owe the bank. Some people might have to sell their possessions just repay the bank.

Ben	: My parents say that although we are not adults, we have to learn how to use money carefully and responsibly. So, we should not buy what we cannot afford and we should not borrow money to buy things.
