Habitat

Native frogs of Aotearoa were once widespread in New Zealand. Unfortunately, except for Stephens and Maud Islands in the Marlborough Sounds they have almost disappeared entirely from the South Island. They are now mainly found only in the upper half of the North Island. Their habitat is very diverse ranging from ground dwelling to damp crevices between boulders to rocky areas in native coastal bush to scrubland and forests high up below the tree line on mountains. The Hochstetter's frog is the only native species which prefers to live in damp areas near creeks and streams. All four native species are able to survive on dry land.
