

PRESENT SIMPLE TENSE II

When you use the Present Simple tense in negative form, you need an auxiliary verb: do or does and the word "not". That will depend on the pronoun you use.

I	don't	study	Maths
You			
We	doesn't		
They			
He			
She			
It			



The verb remains in its simple form, so it mustn't be changed anyway.
