
Here's a quick guide to how the stock market works!

You want to start a business, but you don't have the money you need to buy the materials to make what you want to sell or to rent a place to make or sell them. So... you sell **stock** in your business (company.) That means that each person who gives you a little money to start your business will get a **share** of your profit when you start making money. If you were starting a company, who would you ask to buy shares in it? _____

Of course, there's a **HUGE** risk for the **shareholders**—the people who buy **shares** in your company: your business might totally bomb! If you fail and don't make any money, the shareholders don't make any money either. Plus, they lose the money they **invested**—used to buy shares in your company.
