
## THE PASSIVE VOICE


#### 1 USE

We often use **the passive** when we want to **talk about an action** rather than the person or thing that does the action. In other words, the **action is more important than who carries it out**.

#### 2 FORM

We use a form of **be** + **past participle** of the verb. The object of the **active** becomes the subject of the **passive** verb:


#### 3 REASONS FOR USING THE PASSIVE

We use the passive when...

- it doesn't matter who does the action
   The votes will be counted at the end of the meeting.
- we know or can guess who does the action
   John is being operated on. (obviously by a surgeon.)
- we don't know (or don't want to say) who does the action
   My bicycle has been stolen. (I don't know who stole it.)
- we want to talk about general feelings, beliefs or rules
   Smoking is not allowed in this room. (It's a rule.)
   Swimming is said to be the best form of exercise. (Many people say this.)

**Remember:** If we want to say who or what does the action when using a passive verb, we use **by + person/thing**. We usually put this at the end of the clause or sentence:

Example: This dress was designed by Giorgio
Armani
