

Earthquake in Christchurch



A few years ago, a terrible earthquake happened in the city of Christchurch in New Zealand. It killed 185 people, but Jay Watson had a lucky escape.

- Reporter** What were you doing when the earthquake happened?
- Jay** I wasn't at school that day because I was sick. I was sitting on my bed when I heard a terrible noise and the whole house started shaking.
- Reporter** What did you do?
- Jay** I realized it was an earthquake so I quickly got down on the floor between my bed and the wall. I thought that was the safest place. At school, we often have earthquake drills, so we know what to do in an emergency.
- Reporter** What happened next?
- Jay** Suddenly the wall of my bedroom collapsed and I fell out of the house! I fell about ten metres, from the second floor of the house into the front garden!

- Reporter** Were you hurt?
- Jay** At first I thought I was seriously injured, but I actually only had a few scratches and bruises on my back. I was really lucky!
- Reporter** How did you feel?
- Jay** Scared! And not just because of the fall. Lots of bricks fell on top of me while I was lying on the ground. Our next-door neighbour, who's a firefighter, pulled me out from under the bricks. My mum couldn't believe that I was alive!
- Reporter** How did your life change because of the earthquake?
- Jay** Well, we had to move to a new house because there was so much damage to our old one. It's in a different area, but I still go to the same school. And it's only got one floor, so I feel a bit safer!

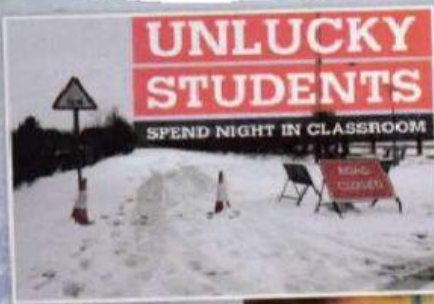
