We use *will*:

- To say what we think, guess, or know will happen in the future.
- When we decide to do something at the moment.

Form:

Questions:

Will + (subject) + (verb)?

Affirmative form:

(subject) + will / 'll + (verb)

Negative form:

(subject) + will not / won't + (verb)
