

One of the most important processes that occurs in schools, of course, is that students learn. When they graduate from high school, many can use a computer, write essays, read and understand complex texts. In addition to learning specific subjects, they learn how to think critically, to evaluate evidence and to have personal opinions on different topics. The school is not alone; students can develop these skills with the help of their families apart from that of the school. Some scientific studies conducted by the University of Bristol show that teachers who are more open to new ideas and less authoritarian help students take responsibility for their studies and obtain higher marks. Some other studies conducted by the Teaching Institute of Edinburgh University have shown that teachers tend to be more demanding when they are of the same social class as their students, but that they tend to be more rigid and non-understanding when they do not belong to the same social class as their students. These theories are quite controversial and there is a considerable discussion about these results in the scientific community. Students may still learn if they have a bad teacher; they simply want to learn and they just do it.
