**i** GRAMMAR NOTES

**Adverbs** are words or phrases that modify a verb, an adjective and other adverbs. Adverbs

- tell you when  
Eg: I sometimes cook for my parents.
- tell you in what way  
Eg: I ate the food prepared hungrily.
- tell you to what extent  
Eg: I completely forgot about my work.
- tell you where  
Eg: I was upstairs when the visitors arrived.

**To Convert Adjectives to Adverbs**

Adjective	To convert	Examples
For most adjectives	Add <i>-ly</i>	• cheap – cheaply • slow – slowly
Adjectives that end in <i>-ic</i>	Add <i>-ally</i>	• basic – basically • ironic – ironically
Adjectives ending with <i>-y</i>	Replace the <i>-y</i> with <i>-ily</i>	• happy – happily • steady – steadily
Adjectives ending with <i>-able, -ible</i> or <i>-ie</i>	Replace the <i>-e</i> with <i>-y</i>	• responsible – responsibly • flexible – flexibly • illegible – illegibly
Adjectives ending with <i>ful</i>	Add <i>ly</i>	• hopeful – hopefully • grateful – gratefully
Irregular adverbs do not follow this rule.	No need to add <i>-ly</i>	• good – well • fast – fast • early – early • hard – hard • late – late • daily – daily

*Common Mistakes*

- ✓ It is **too hot** to go out.
- ✗ It is **very hot** to go out.
- ✓ She drove **carefully**.
- ✗ She **carefully** drove.
- ✓ The hall is **spacious enough** to carry out the activities.
- ✗ The hall is **enough spacious** to carry out the activities.
- ✓ They behaved in a **cowardly** manner.
- ✗ They behaved manner **cowardly**.
- ✓ He plays badminton **well**.
- ✗ He plays badminton **good**.
