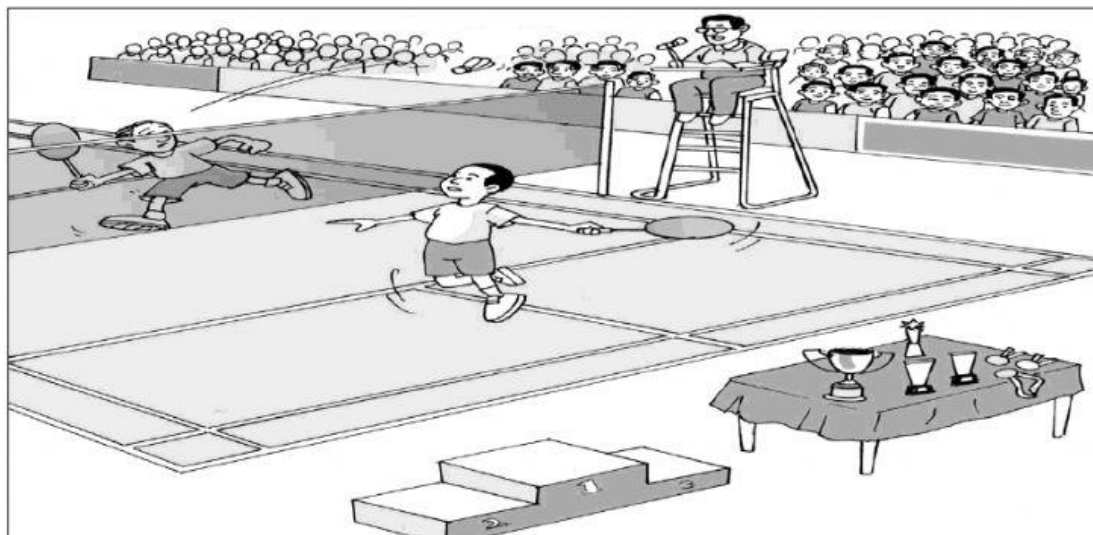

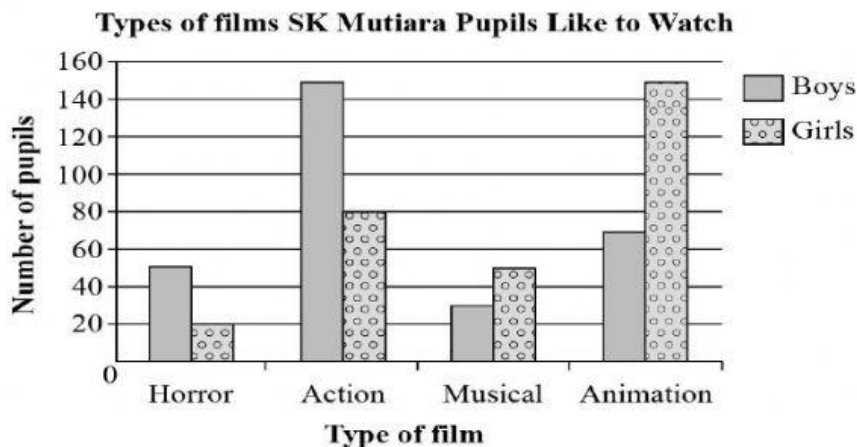

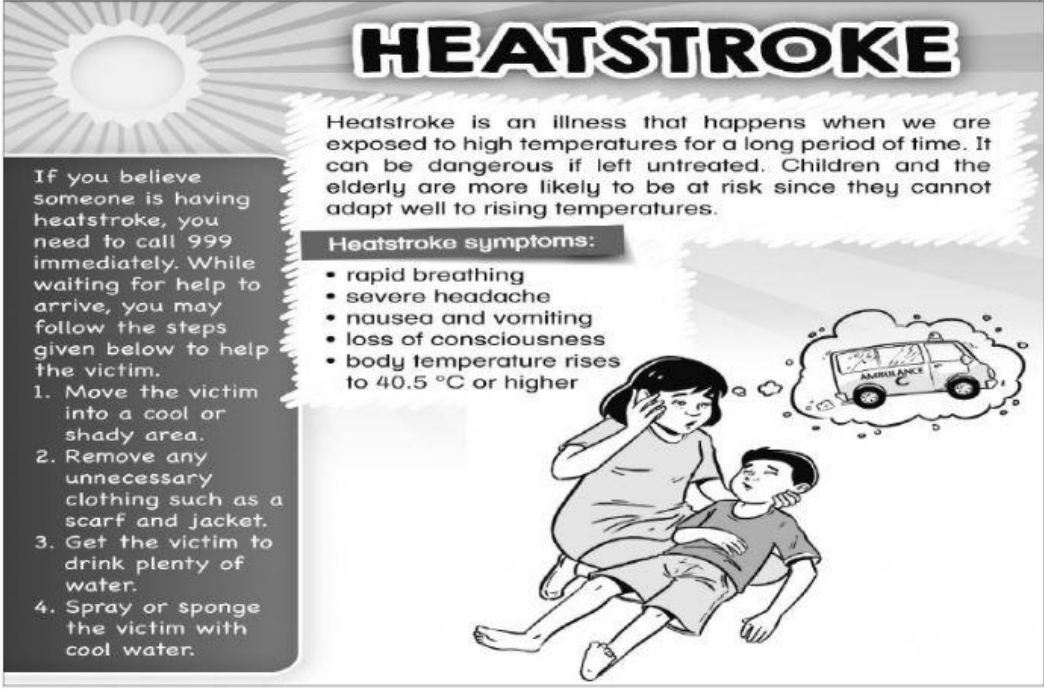

HEATSTROKE

Heatstroke is an illness that happens when we are exposed to high temperatures for a long period of time. It can be dangerous if left untreated. Children and the elderly are more likely to be at risk since they cannot adapt well to rising temperatures.

Heatstroke symptoms:

- rapid breathing
- severe headache
- nausea and vomiting
- loss of consciousness
- body temperature rises to 40.5 °C or higher

If you believe someone is having heatstroke, you need to call 999 immediately. While waiting for help to arrive, you may follow the steps given below to help the victim.

1. Move the victim into a cool or shady area.
2. Remove any unnecessary clothing such as a scarf and jacket.
3. Get the victim to drink plenty of water.
4. Spray or sponge the victim with cool water.

Question 23

Read the text below and answer the questions that follow.

Turtles are reptiles with hard shells that protect them from predators. Just like human bones, a turtle's shell is actually part of its skeleton. It is made up of over 50 bones, which include the turtle's ribcage and spine. Depending on the species, turtles may be carnivores, herbivores or omnivores.

There are four species of turtles that can be found in Malaysia. They are the leatherback, green, hawksbill and olive-ridley turtles. These turtles are known for their **longevity**. Sadly, the number of turtles in most places has **plummeted** and some are on the brink of extinction. Their biggest threats include the loss of nesting and feeding habitats, excessive egg-collection, poaching and pollution.

Today, it is estimated that there are over 100 million tonnes of plastic in the oceans around the world. Since plastic does not decompose, some turtles may accidentally consume bits and pieces of plastic, mistaking them for food. This will injure or kill them. So one of the simplest things we can do to help protect turtles is to avoid or stop using plastic products.
