

## USE OF ENGLISH:

### FUTURE IN THE PAST

The *future in the past* is used to refer to something that was the future at some time in the past. It does not matter if the future event happened or not as it was thought to be the future at the time.

<b>WAS/WERE GOING TO</b>	It is used to talk about a past future firm plan, intention or a prediction with evidence.	<i>I <b>was going to</b> head up into the mountains. We <b>were going to</b> contact the emergency line but the landline was not working.</i>
<b>WOULD</b>	It is used to talk about a past future promise or prediction with no evidence.	<i>I knew it <b>would</b> be tough.</i>
<b>ABOUT TO</b>	It is used to talk about something that was going to happen very soon.	<i>We were <b>about to</b> leave.</i>
