

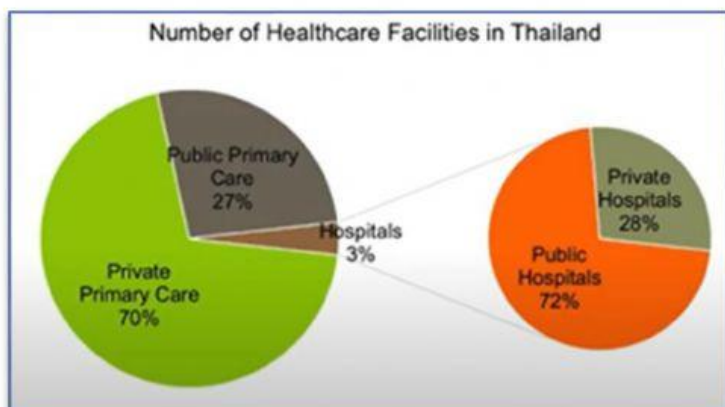
Health Care Services in Thailand

- : Read the information about the provision of Health Care Services in Thailand. Next answer the questions below.

The health care services system is an organization of people, institutions and resources that deliver health care services.

The health care services include diagnosis, treatment, prevention and rehabilitation of diseases and injury on the population.

In Thailand each person, citizen, has equal right to receive standard public healthcare services and the poor to have the right to free medical treatment from the government.



Health Care services cover four key aspects of health care which are health promotion, prevention of diseases, medical care and rehabilitation.

- Health promotion aims to increase control over health and its determinants. This is to support and strengthen the

skills of people and change the social, economic and environmental conditions to alleviate their impact on people's health.

- Prevention of diseases, disorders and injuries is closely linked to health promotion. That is avoiding diseases through early detection of illnesses and vaccines.
- Medical care aims to treat the health conditions or at least limit the impact on the patients by providing patients with proper medicines and therapies.
- Rehabilitation aims to assist people who have illnesses or injuries to make a full recovery.

The infrastructure of health care is divided into three types: Public, Private and other public agencies.

Thailand's health Services are divided up into 5 levels: Each level provided a different level of care based around the degree of ill health or sickness.

- Self-Care Level
- Fundamental care level
- Primary Care level
- Secondary-Care level
- Tertiary-Care level
