

The tense of a sentence is shown by its verb.

For example: He jumped. (past) He jumps. (present) He will jump. (future)

Present tense is usually used to talk about actions that:

* occur regularly in the present. E.g. He watches TV everyday.

* represent 'timeless' actions. E.g. Tom reads history books.

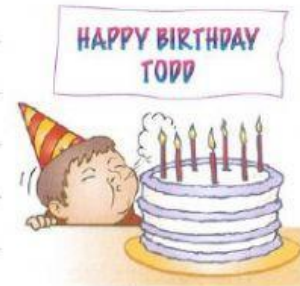
Past tense refers to something that has already happened. E.g. He watched TV yesterday.



Present tense	Past tense
Monkeys eat bananas.	The monkeys ate bananas.
Amanda walks to school.	Amanda walked to school.
Jack jumps over the hurdle.	Jack jumped over the hurdle.
