Nouns ending in -f or -fe by removing the -f or -fe → -ves.

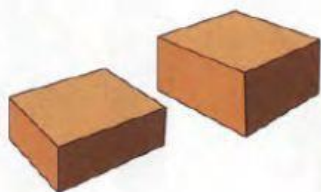
