Past Perfect

Past perfect is a compound verbal tense that we use to talk about past events, however, it is very special because we use it to talk about actions that happened before a specific event or action in the past. For using this verbal tense we need to be familiar with the past participle form of the verb; Ex: eaten, drunk, driven, seen, gone, been, read, listened, pronounced, happened... Remember that these verbs can be regular and irregular. In this case for structuring the past perfect we have to use the verb Have in past and the past participle of the main verb.

Ex 1: I had already gone when you arrived or

Ex 2: I forgot that I hadn't taken my umbrella when I left home this morning.
