Grammar: Subject and Predicate

A sentence has **two** parts: a **subject** (naming part) and a **predicate** (telling part). The **subject** tells who or what the sentence is about. The **predicate** tells more about the subject (naming part). It tells what someone or something is doing or did.

Example: Mrs. McPhee **drove her car to school.**

Mrs. McPhee is the **subject**. She is who the sentence is about. **Drove her car to school** is the **predicate** because it tells what she did.
