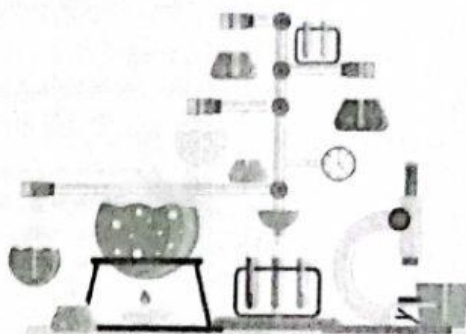



Languages

My mother tongue is the Malay language which is the only language used in my family. When I was 5 years old, my father enrolled me in an English medium kindergarten. There, I was given the chance to choose either to learn Mandarin or the Malay language. I attended the trial classes for both languages. The teacher taught us to count from 1 to 10 in Mandarin and made us repeat her pronunciation as she pointed to the digits on the whiteboard. Although I did not choose the Mandarin class, I could still remember the lesson because the teacher continuously instructed the Mandarin class pupils to repeat the same lesson every day. They were loud so I could hear them clearly from the next room. Some researches show that children often imitate the sounds and patterns which they hear around them until a habit is formed. I suppose that is the logical reasoning of why I know how to count from 1 to 10 in Mandarin even though I did not take the class.

English had been a subject I was good at in school because my mother was an English teacher and she taught me grammar when I started primary school. My father would cut out pictures and articles from newspapers and pasted them in exercise books to provide writing exercises for me to do. I picked up a reading habit later on when I was 8 years old. My parents realised my growing interest in it and started making weekend trips to the local library to let me read more. When I entered my secondary school, I began to read English novels and grew an interest in reading thrillers so I started reading more serious novels.

My father is fluent in Thai language due to his family background but he did not teach my siblings and me the language. I have never asked him why to this day.
