**RENEWAL SPURS**

1. The permanent, main stem of the grapevine.
2. The new soft growth on one-year old wood, with leaves, tendrils, and flowers clusters that develop into grapes.
3. Mature, woody, brown parts of the grapevine.
4. Used in grape training and pruning when referring to the "arms" of a grapevine that extend from the trunk. They are often positioned horizontally along a trellis wire.
5. One-year-old short canes pruned to two to four buds.
6. Spurs cut back to only one node to grow shoots for next year's fruiting canes.
7. Shoots that grow at the lower part of the trunk.
8. The physical structure used as support for grapevines.
