Simple Subjects and Simple Predicates

The **simple subject** is the part of the sentence that tells who or what the sentence is all about.

The **simple predicate** is the part of the sentence that tells what the subject is doing or what it is.

For example: *Bobby hugs the dog.*

Bobby (simple subject) *hugs* (simple predicate)
