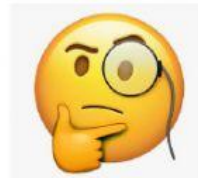




## Simple Past vs. Present Perfect



PAST SIMPLE	PRESENT PERFECT
<b>Specific times in the past</b>  yesterday, five minutes ago, in 2000, the other day, last month  <b>Examples:</b>  I went to the park yesterday. I studied in China in 2010.	<b>Vague times in the past</b>  ever/never, not yet, already, so far, to date, till now, up to the present  <b>Examples:</b>  I've <b>never</b> gone to the park. I haven't been to China <b>yet</b> .
