

Comparative Adjectives ending with -y (Perbandingan)

Lesson Recap

We use comparative adjectives to compare two nouns (objects, people and place).

Usually, comparative adjectives are added '-er' at the end of the adjective. When comparing, we need to use word 'than' after the adjectives.

- 1) Today we are going to learn how to write comparative adjectives that end with -y.
- 2) Some adjectives end with -y, for example:
earlyy, happy, sorry, lazy

In this case, we need to change -y to -i.

early $\longrightarrow$ earli

Now, add -er at the end

earli+er $\longrightarrow$ earlier

And, do not forget to put 'than'

earlier than

Example: I arrived earlier than my friend.
