

Auxiliary Verbs and Main Verbs – Have

'Have' can function as a main verb or as an auxiliary verb.

As a main verb meaning take:

I **have** a shower every day. (this means I take a shower every day.)

We _____ dinner at 7.00 pm. (we eat/take our dinner at 7.00 pm.)

I _____ sugar in my tea. (I take/put sugar in my tea.)

As a main verb meaning own or possess:

Her uncle is very rich. He **has** a lot of money in the bank. (he owns or possesses the money)

My neighbour _____ a white car just like yours. (owns or possesses a white car)

They _____ three children. (The children belong to them)

'Have' can be used with the auxiliary 'do' or 'don't' to create a question or a negative statement.

Do you **have** any dogs? (do you own any dogs?)

Do you _____ any children? (the children belong to you)

Do you _____ my telephone number? (Is my telephone number in your possession?)

Do you _____ milk in your coffee? (Do you take/put milk in your coffee?)

I **don't have** sugar in my tea. (I don't put/take sugar in my tea.)

I _____ a shower every day because there are water restrictions.

I _____ breakfast every day because I am often late for work.

I **don't have** any animals. (There are no animals in my home)

I _____ your address. (I don't know where you live)

I can't go to the movie with you because I _____ any money. (I can't afford it)

Have used in Perfect Tenses: (auxiliary)

I **haven't finished** the work yet. (finish)

They _____ yet, but they will be here soon. (not arrive)

I _____ the dishes, so now I will dry them and put them away. (wash)

I _____ the book yet but I will start reading it tomorrow. (not read)

My mouth is sore because I _____ my tooth _____ out (pull)

Questions:

you to take the book back to the library? (remember)
they all the sports equipment away? (put)
you reading the newspaper? (finish)

Continuous tenses:

She **is having** her flat **renovated** soon.

We our house next month. (paint)

My mother her hair today (style)

My aunt her appendix tomorrow. (remove)

They a big party this weekend.

We our lawn on Sunday. (mow)

Doing something oneself or having it done by someone else:

I went to the hairdresser yesterday to **have** my hair **cut**. (cut by someone else)

I was tired of long hair, so I cut it yesterday. (I cut it myself)

I my nails in preparation for my wedding. (paint) done by someone else

I painted my nails in preparation for my wedding. (I painted the nails myself)

We our family photographs by a professional photographer. (take)

I took photographs of my family. (I did it myself)

We our house last month (paint)

I painted our house last month.

Modal Verbs of obligation (have to = must)

I **have to finish** this report before I go to bed. (**finish**) I **must** finish this report before I go to bed.

You the rules of the road when driving. (obey) You **must** obey the rules of the road when driving.

You hard at school in order to get a good job. (work) You work hard at school in order to get a good job.

You your driver's licence in order to drive a car. (get) You get your driver's licence in order to drive a car.
