Read the notes below

Modal verbs to make suggestions and give advice

Modal verbs are always followed by a base form of a verb or an infinitive verb (-ing) without 'to'. Below are the modal verbs that you can use to make suggestion and give advice.

Should

'Should' is used when the speaker wants to make a strong suggestion.

Example: You look exhausted, Donna. I don't think you should work too hard at the hotel.

Ought to

In more formal situations you can use 'ought to' instead of 'should', but this modal verb is not used in negative statements and questions.

Example: Jane ought to visit that castle, it's great!

Had better

If you want to give an important piece of advice, warning or recommendation (that can have a negative consequence if not followed), use 'had better'.

Example: You had better take time off from the hotel or you will get sick soon.

Could

'Could' is not as strong as 'should' and is normally used to give mild advice or to suggest a solution to some problem.

Example: If Donna needs some rest, she could take a holiday to Monaco.
