<u>make ends meet</u>	(v) to earn just enough money to live on
<u>well off</u>	(adj) wealthy or financially comfortable
<u>disposable income</u>	(n) income remaining after taxes and social security payments (rent/expenses, etc); money available to spend or save as one wishes
<u>hardship</u>	(n) severe suffering; a very difficult time
<u>live within our means</u>	(v phrase) when the money you spend each month is less than or equal to the money you make; not spending more than you can afford
<u>affluent</u>	(adj) having a great deal of money; wealthy
<u>impoverished</u>	(adj) made poor, living in poverty
<u>destitute</u>	(adj) completely lacking any money and the basic necessities of life
<u>deprived</u>	(adj) suffering a severe and damaging lack of basic material and cultural benefits
<u>prosperity</u>	(n) in a state of being prosperous; flourishing financially
