More women go to work now and many of them can even hold higher positions and get better-paid jobs than their husbands. While they have to carry out household duties traditionally done by a housewife, they have as well to fulfil their roles at work like their male colleagues.

By and by and sooner or later, there will be serious tension in the marriage if the husband refuses to give a helping hand when it comes to the house chores.
