PHRASAL VERBS

GET

ON

TO GET ON :
When you get on a bus or train.
(Subirse)
To start/continue doing an activity
(Empezar o continuar una actividad)

OFF

TO GET OFF:
When you get off a bus or train.
(Bajarse)

STUCK

TO GET STUCK :
If you get stuck in a place or in a situation, you are trapped and can't get out.
(Quedarse atascado)

BACK

TO GET BACK:
To return to your house or the place where you started.
(Regresar)

ON WITH

TO GET ON WITH:
When you get on with someone, you are friends.
(Llevarse bien con...)

AROUND TO

TO GET AROUND TO :
To find the time to do something after waiting.
(Sacar tiempo para hacer algo)

UP

TO GET UP:
You stop sitting or lying down and you stand up.
(Levantarse)

RID OF

TO GET RID OF :
To throw something away, give it away or sell it so you don't have it anymore.
(Deshacerse de algo)
