USED TO

1. Form:

(+) S + used to + Verb

(-) S + didn't + use to + Verb

(?) Did + S + use to + Verb?

2. Usage:

- We use this expression to talk about **habits or repeated actions in the past** which we don't do in the present.
- We also use it to talk about **states in the past which are no longer true**. => Việc đã từng làm trong quá khứ, nay không làm nữa.

Ex: I used to have long hair (but now I have short hair).

They used to live in India (but now they live in Germany).

Did you use to be a teacher? Yes, I did.

I didn't use to want to have a nice house.

BE / GET USED TO

1. Form:

(+) S + to be/ get + used to + V-ing.

(-) S + not + to be / get + used to + V-ing.

(?) To be + S + used to + V-ing?

Do/ Does / Did... + S + get + used to + V-ing?

Ex: I can't **get used to getting** up so early. I'm tired all the time.

He's **not used to** the weather here yet. He's finding it very cold.
